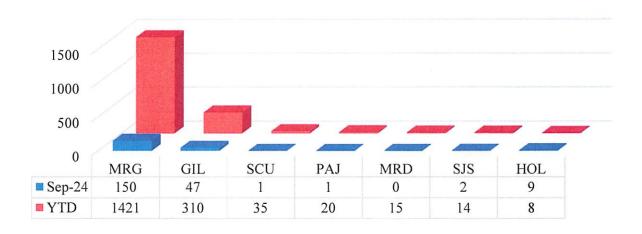

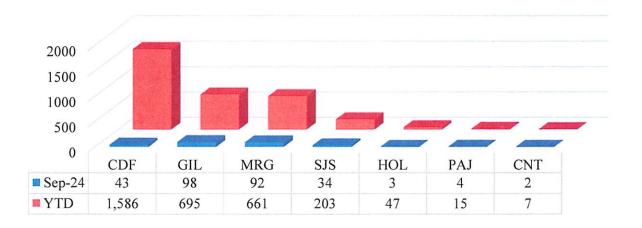

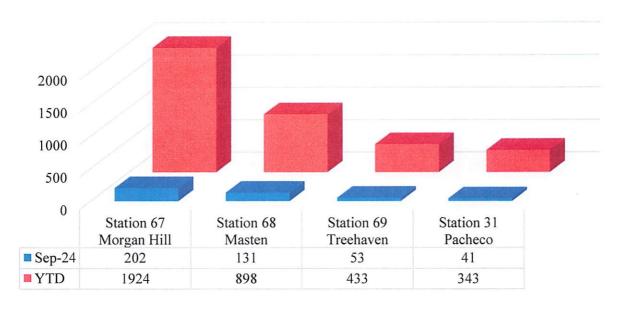
Aid Responses Provided By Jurisdiction



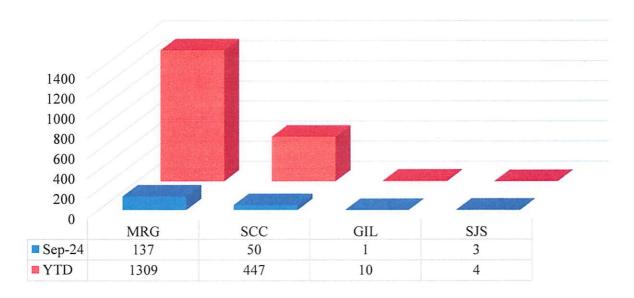
Aid Responses Received By Agency



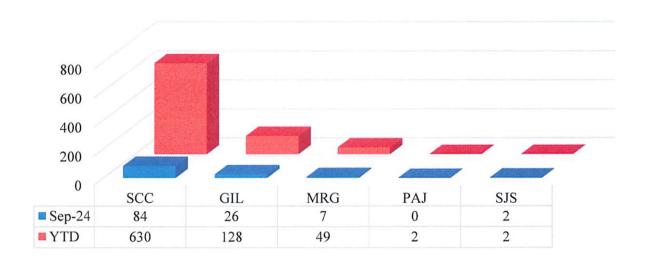
Call Volume By Station



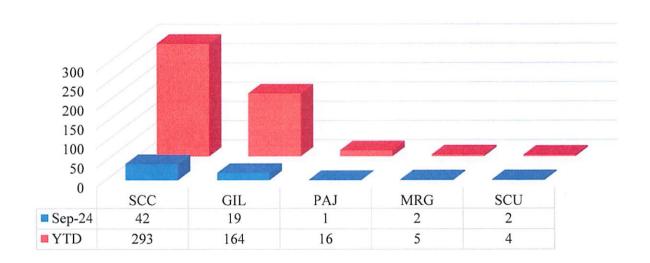
Engine 67's Call Volume By Jurisdiction

ITEM 464. – MITIGATION FEES BI-MONTHLY REPORT FOR September 1, 2024 – September 30, 2024

Submitted to the SOUTH SANTA CLARA COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

Monthly Reports

The South Santa Clara County Fire District Board of Commissioners requires reports of mitigation activity to include collections and expenditures to be submitted to the Board Bi-Monthly.

Background

On September 28, 2004, Board of Supervisors of Santa Clara County adopted Ordinance No. NS-1104 establishing authority for imposing on and charging to development in the County of Santa Clara impact fees to pay for such developments equitable share of the cost of public improvements needed to mitigate the impacts of new development.

Section C19-2 of the Santa Clara County Ordinance Code authorizes imposition of development fees necessary to fund fire protection facilities and equipment.

On January 11, 2005, the Board of Directors of the South Santa Clara County Fire District adopted a resolution establishing fire protection mitigation fees.

On July 8, 2015, David Taussig and Associates completed a Development Impact Fee Justification Study for the South Santa Clara County Fire District. The study included an updated Fire Capital Facilities Plan and recommendations for increases to the current Impact Fee rates.

On August 25, 2015, the Board of Directors of the South Santa Clara County Fire District adopted Resolution No. SCCFD – 2015 – 01 adopting the District's Development Impact Fee Justification Study and Plan and intent to update the District's Development Impact Fees.

On October 6, 2015, the Board of Supervisors of Santa Clara County adopted Resolution No. BOS – 2015 – 137 modifying the District's Development Impact Mitigation Fees and accepting the Capital Facilities and Equipment Plan.

On December 15, 2015, the Board of Directors of the South Santa Clara County Fire Protection District adopted Resolution No. SCFD – 2015 – 03 accepting the five-year findings related to the unexpended fund balance for Development Impact/Mitigation Fees.

On June 18, 2019, the Board of Directors of the South Santa Clara County Fire Protection District adopted Resolution No. BOS – 2019 – 96 modifying the District's Development Impact Mitigation Fees.

On October 20, 2020, the Board of Directors of the South Santa Clara County Fire Protection District adopted Resolution No. SCFD – 2020 – 1 accepting the five-year findings related to the unexpended fund balance for Development Impact/Mitigation Fees.

On July 1, 2021, fees were increased om accordance with Resolution No. SCFD – 2019 – 96 passed by the Board of Directors on June 18, 2019. This Resolution states that the Districts' mitigation fees shall be indexed annually to the average of the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, CA Consumer Price Index, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the twelve-month period ending May of the previous fiscal year, and not to exceed three percent in any given year to ensure that the fee continues to reflect actual cost.

On July 1, 2022, fees were increased by 3% in accordance with Resolution No. SCFD – 2019 – 96 passed by the Board of Directors on June 18, 2019. The Resolution states that the Districts' mitigation fees shall be indexed annually to average of the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, CA Consumer Price Index, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the twelve-month ending May of the previous fiscal year, and not to exceed three percent in any given year to ensure that the fee continues to reflect actual cost.

Mitigation Expenditures

There were \$6,257.12 funds expended from the Mitigation Fees for the reporting period 2023/2024 for a refund on a cancelled project.

Committed Funds

The South Santa Clara County Fire District has committed mitigation funds collected through FY 2023-24 which are currently held in reserve for capital improvements at Masten Station located at 10810 No Name Uno, Gilroy, CA and Treehaven Station located at 3050 Hecker Pass, Gilroy, CA. The SSCCFD will expand the stations to

accommodate additional staffing added to engines. The additional staffing was needed to protect new development within the District boundaries.

Cash Receipts

During the reporting period, September 1, 2024, to September 30, 2024, \$2,693.36 in fees were collected. The fees collected reflect 3 single family residences, 1 commercial, 1 attached garage.

VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TERMS AND CONDITIONS

DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE PROTECTION

STATE OF CALIFORNIA Natural Resources Agency

Agreement for the Volunteer Fire Assistance Program of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered between the STATE of California, acting through the Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection hereinafter called "STATE", and South Santa Clara County Fire District hereinafter called "LOCAL AGENCY", covenants as follows:

RECITALS:

- STATE has been approved as a passthrough agent of the United States Department of Agriculture, (USDA), Forest Service for the purpose of administering the Volunteer Fire Assistance program in California, hereinafter referred to as VFA, authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistant Act of 1978 (PL 95-313, 92 Stat, 365, 16 U.S.C. 2106 as amended).
- 2. This is a subaward under the 2024 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant #24-DG-11052012-171 awarded to STATE by the Forest Service on August 23, 2024. The Federal Assistance Listing for the award is 10.698, Cooperative Fire Program. This subaward is funded solely with Federal funds and is subject to the Office of Management and Budget (0MB) guidance in subparts A through F of 2 CFR Part 200, as adopted and supplemented by the USDA in 2 CFR Part 400, and under certain terms and conditions to LOCAL AGENCY to assist LOCAL AGENCY to upgrade its fire protection capability.
- 3. LOCAL AGENCY desires to participate in said VFA and agrees to the terms and conditions specified in the Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Assistance Program 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

- 4. <u>APPROVAL:</u> This Agreement is of no force or effect until signed by both parties and approved by the Department of General Services, if required. LOCAL AGENCY may not commence performance until such approval has been obtained.
- 5. <u>INCORPORATION:</u> The Procedural Guide for Volunteer Fire Assistance Program 2024, submitted Application for Funding and associated Grant Assurances are hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Grant Agreement.
- 6. TIMELINESS: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 7. FORFEITURE OF AWARD: LOCAL AGENCY must return this Agreement and required resolution properly signed and executed to STATE at the email address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than December 1, 2024 or LOCAL AGENCY will forfeit the funds.

8. <u>GRANT AND BUDGET CONTIGENCY CLAUSE:</u> It is mutually understood between the parties that this **Agreement** may have been written for the mutual benefit of both parties before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, to avoid program and fiscal delays that would occur if the **Agreement** were executed after that determination was made.

This **Agreement** is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the STATE by the United States Government for the **State Fiscal Year 2024** for the purpose of this program. In addition, this **Agreement** is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, or conditions enacted by the Congress or to any statute enacted by the Congress that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this **Agreement** in any manner.

The parties mutually agree that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this **Agreement** shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The STATE has the option to invalidate the **Agreement** under the 30-day cancellation clause or to amend the **Agreement** to reflect any reduction in funds.

- 9. REIMBURSEMENT: STATE will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY, from funds made available to STATE by the Federal Government, an amount not to exceed \$9,835.76 on a 50/50 matching funds basis, for the performance of specific projects and/or purchase of specific items identified in Proposed Project, Application for Funding, attached hereto. Reimbursement will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and JUNE 30, 2025. This sum is the sole and maximum payment that STATE will make pursuant to this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY must bill STATE at the e-mail address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than September 1, 2025 in order to receive the funds. The bill submitted by LOCAL AGENCY must clearly delineate the projects performed and/or items purchased. A vendor's invoice and proof of payment to vendor(s) must be included for items purchased.
- IO. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>: Expenditure of the funds distributed by STATE herein is subject to the same limitations as placed by the VFA, upon expenditure of United States Government Funds. Pursuant to 2CFR200.3 13 Equipment, subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in that section; title to any equipment and supplies acquired under this **Agreement** vests with the LOCAL AGENCY. For any equipment items over \$5,000, the federal government may retain a vested interested in accordance with paragraph 17 below.
- I1. MATCHING FUNDS: Any and all funds paid to LOCAL AGENCY under the terms of this Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "VFA Funds", shall be matched by LOCAL AGENCY on a dollar-for-dollar basis, for each project listed on attachment(s) hereto identified as "Proposed Project". No amount of unpaid "contributed" or "volunteer" labor or services shall be used or consigned in calculating the matching amount "actually spent" by LOCAL AGENCY.

LOCAL AGENCY shall not use VFA Funds as matching funds for other federal grants, including Department of Interior (USDI) Rural Fire Assistance grants, nor use funds from other federal grants, including USDI Rural Fire Assistance grants, as matching funds for VFA Funds.

- 13. <a href="PURPOSE: Any project to be funded hereunder must be intended to specifically assist LOCAL AGENCY to organize, train, and/or equip local firefighting forces in the aforementioned rural area and community to prevent or suppress fires which threaten life, resources, and/or improvements within the area of operation of LOCAL AGENCY. Project funds are not to be used for research and development.
- 14. <u>COMBINING:</u> In the event funds are paid for two or more separate, but closely related projects, the 50/50 cost-sharing formula will be applied to the total cost of such combined projects.
- 15. OVERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project exceeds the estimate of costs upon which this Agreement is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request additional funds to cover the **Agreement** share of the amount exceeded. However, there is no assurance that any such funds are, or may be, available for reimbursement. Any increase in funding will require an amendment.
- 16. <u>UNDERRUNS:</u> In the event that the total cost of a funded project is less than the estimate of costs upon which this **Agreement** is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request that additional eligible projects/items be approved by STATE for **Agreement** funding. However, there is no assurance that any such approval will be funded. Approval of additional projects/items, not listed on the Proposed Project application, made by STATE, will be in writing and will require an amendment.
- 17. FEDERAL INTEREST IN EQUIPMENT: The Federal Government has a vested interest in any item purchased with VFA funding in excess of \$5,000 regardless of the length of this **Agreement**, until such time as the fair market value is less than \$5,000. The VFA percentage used to purchase the equipment will be applied to the sale price and recovered for the Government during the sale. This percentage will remain the same even following depreciation. The Federal Government may not have to be reimbursed if the disposal sale amounts to a fair market value of less than \$5,000. LOCAL AGENCY will notify STATE of the disposal of such items.

- 18. <u>EQUIPMENT INVENTORY:</u> Any single item purchased in excess of\$5,000 will be assigned an VFA Property Number by the STATE. LOCAL AGENCY shall forward a copy of the purchase documents listing the item, brand, model, serial number, any LOCAL AGENCY property number assigned, and a LOCAL AGENCY contact and return address to STATE at the address specified in paragraph 12. The STATE will advise the LOCAL AGENCY Contact of the VFA Property Number assigned.
- 19. <u>AUDIT:</u> LOCAL AGENCY agrees that the STATE, the Department of General Services, the Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this **Agreement.** LOCAL AGENCY agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of five (5) years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, LOCAL AGENCY agrees to include a similar right of the State of California to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this **Agreement.** (GC 8546.7, PCC 10115 et seq., CCR Title 2, Section 1896).
- 20. <u>DISPUTES:</u> In the event of any dispute over qualifying matching expenditures of LOCAL AGENCY or audit findings, the dispute will be decided by STATE and its decision shall be final and binding.
- 21. <u>MONITORING:</u> LOCAL AGENCY agrees to the monitoring of activities as necessary by STATE to ensure that the award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the agreement; and that performance goals are achieved.
- 22. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless, the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims and losses, accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this **Agreement**, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by LOCAL AGENCY in the performance of this **Agreement**.
- 23. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS:</u> LOCAL AGENCY agrees to comply with civil rights requirements as detailed in the Complying With Civil Rights Requirements brochure (FS-850). and the And Justice For All poster (AD-475A). The poster is to be placed at all public point of contact/reception areas.
- 24. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS:</u> LOCAL AGENCY will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:
 - a. Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
 - b. Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:

- I) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
- 2) the person's or organization's policy of maintaining a drugfree workplace;
- any available counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and,
- 4) penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
- c. Every employee who works on the proposed Agreement will:
 - 1) receive a copy of the company's drug-free workplace policy statement; and,
 - 2) agree to abide by the terms of the company's statement as a condition of employment on the Agreement.

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in suspension of payments under the Agreement or termination of the Agreement or both and LOCAL AGENCY may be ineligible for funding of any future State Agreement if the department determines that any of the following has occurred: (1) the LOCAL AGENCY has made false certification, or violated the certification by failing to carry out the requirements as noted above. (GC 8350 et seq.)

- 25. <u>TERM:</u> The term of the Agreement SHALL COMMENCE ON THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and continue through June 30, 2025.
- 26. <u>TERMINATION:</u> This Agreement may be terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice to the other party or provisions herein amended upon mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- 27. <u>AMENDMENTS:</u> No amendment or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or Agreement not incorporated in the Agreement is binding on any of the parties.
- 28. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:</u> LOCAL AGENCY, and the agents and employees of LOCAL AGENCY, in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the STATE or the Federal Government.
- 29. <u>INDIRECT RATE:</u> LOCAL AGENCY may not assess an indirect rate in excess oftheir Federally approved Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA), a de minimis rate if LOCAL AGENCY does not have an approved NICRA, or the VFA program cap rate of 10%, whichever is lesser. LOCAL AGENCY may also elect not to assess an indirect rate. The approved indirect cost rate at the time of execution is 0%.

- 30. <u>MEDIA:</u> LOCAL AGENCY shall acknowledge STATE and USDA Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals and electronic media developed as a result of this award.
 - It is encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this award and announce progress and accomplishments, acknowledging STATE and USDA Forest Service support. Follow direction in USDA Supplemental 2 CFR 415.2.
- 31. <u>ASSIGNMENT:</u> This Agreement is not assignable by LOCAL AGENCY either in whole or in part.

SOUTH SANTA CLARA COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT

The Political Reform Act, California Government Code Section 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with Appendix in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the South Santa Clara County Fire District.

Persons holding designated positions shall file Statements of Economic Interests with the District's filing official. If statements are received in signed paper format, the District's filing official shall make and retain a copy and forward the original statements to the filing officer, the County of Santa Clara Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. If Statements are electronically filed using the County of Santa Clara's Form 700 e-filing system, both the District's filing official and the County of Santa Clara Clerk of the Board of Supervisors will receive access to the e-filed Statements simultaneously. The District shall retain Statements of Economic Interests as public records available for public inspection and reproduction pursuant to Government Code section 81008.

The County of Santa Clara Board of Supervisors sits as the governing board of the District. The Board Members are subject to the disclosure requirements under Government Code section 87200.

* Newly Created Positions

A newly created position that makes or participates in the making of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest of the position-holder, and which specific position title is not yet listed in an agency's conflict of interest code is included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code, subject to the following limitation:

The Unit Chief or designee may determine in writing that a particular newly-created position, although a "designated position", is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the broadest disclosure requirements, but instead must comply with more tailored disclosure requirements specific to that newly created position. Such written determination shall include a description of the newly created position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Unit Chief or designee's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code. (Gov. Code Section 81008.)

As soon as the District has a newly created position that must file statements of economic interests, the district shall contact the County of Santa Clara Clerk of the Board of Supervisors Form 700 division to notify it of the new position title to be added in the County's electronic Form 700 record management system, known as eDisclosure. Upon this notification, the Clerk's Office shall enter the actual position title of the newly created position into eDisclosure and the District shall ensure that the name of any individual(s) holding the newly created position is entered under that position title in eDisclosure. Additionally, within 90 days of the creation of a newly created position that must file statements of economic interests, the District shall update this conflict of interest code to add the actual position title in its list of designated positions, and submit the amended conflict of interest code to the County of Santa Clara Office of the County Counsel for code-reviewing body approval by the County Board of Supervisors. (Gov. Code Sec. 87306)

APPENDEX B

Conflict of Interest Code of the South Santa Clara County Fire District

Disclosure Categories:

Category 1

Persons holding designated positions in this category must report:

- (1) All investments in, business positions in, and income (including gifts, loans and travel payments) from:
 - (a) Any source that provides, plans to provide, or has provided in the last two years, leased facilities, goods, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services, including training or consulting services, of the type utilized by the District;
 - (b) Any source that is subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of, or has an application for a license or permit pending before, the District;
 - (c) Any source that receives, is planning to apply to receive, or has received in the last two years, grants or other monies from or through the District; and
- (2) All interests in real property located entirely or partly within the District's boundaries, or within two miles of District boundaries, or of any land owned or used by the District.

Category 2

Consultants, as defined for purposes of the Political Reform Act, shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the conflict of interest code subject to the following limitation: The Unit Chief or designee may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements of the broadest disclosure category, but instead must comply with more tailored disclosure requirements specific to that consultant. Such a determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. All such determinations are public records and shall be retained for public inspection along with this conflict of interest code.
